- 12. The project work is a team/ group work. Each group shall not exceed five members. The students should ensure that the work is original. It should follow proper reference style, preferably APA style. Two hard copies of the project report should be submitted to the Department on or before February 15.
- 13. Project valuation: A panel of experts appointed by the university to evaluate the project report at the CV camp (external evaluation =25 marks) and internal evaluation based on Viva Voce exam as per the university norms (internal valuation= 25 marks). The Project work will be treated as a full course and total marks is 50. An examiner may evaluate only 7 projects per day: Four projects in the FN and Three projects in the AN. Remuneration for project evaluation may be fixed by the University.

Specifications

1. A Project work culminating in a dissertation should be undertaken by all students. Students may identify topics of their choice and finalize it in consultation with the supervising teacher.

2. Project work shall be carried out under the supervision of a teacher in the parent department. The allocation of supervisors shall be done by the concerned department.

3. The Project work shall be prepared according to the general guidelines provide by MLA. Two typed copies of the Project report shall be submitted to the HOD two weeks before the commencement of the ESE.

4. The Project shall have both internal as well as external evaluation. The external evaluation of the project shall be followed by a viva voce at the end of the semester.

5.Each student has to do the Project work independently. Collaborative projects are not acceptable.

6. The teaching hour allotted for project may be utilized for discussing documentation styles, research methodology and the formalities of academic writing.

7. The Project Report must be between 25-30 typed A4 size pages (10000 words), with double spacing between the lines and a size 12 easily readable typeface. As far as possible the report may be printed on one side of the paper only with a left margin of 1.5 inches and a margin of 1 inch on all other sides. Indent the first line of each paragraph by 1.5 inches and do not justify the text at the right margin.

8. Plagiarism of all sorts will be penalized.

Guidelines for Evaluation (6B11 ENG)

1. Total marks for Project is 25 (20 external and 5 internal)

2. The ESE of the Project work shall be conducted by two external examiners

3.Submission of Project Report and presence of the student for viva are compulsory for internal evaluation

4. No marks shall be awarded to a candidate if he/she fails to submit the Project Report for external evaluation

5. A student shall be declared to pass in the Project Report Course if he/she secures minimum 40% marks of the aggregate and 40% separately for external

6. In case a candidate fails, the Project work may be redone and the report may be resubmitted along with subsequent exams

7. There shall be no improvement chance

Internal Evaluation: (Total Marks= 5)

Criteria like accountability, punctuality and the effort that has gone into the work related to the project should be taken into consideration while awarding the internal marks. If necessary, a viva-voce examination related to the project or even a presentation by the student about the project could be used as criteria for awarding internal marks.

General Guidelines of Project Work

- 1. Students should undertake the project work related to Chemistry only.
- 2. The UG level project work is a group activity, maximum number of students being limited to five. However each student should prepare and submit the project report separate
- 3 The matter should be typed on A-4 size paper with Times New Roman font of size 12 points, with double spacing between the lines and margins of 1.5' at the left, 1' at the right, 1' each at the top and bottom.
- 4 The report should be printed in plain white paper in black ink only. Color inks for charts and graphs can be used, provided it does not hamper the readability. The logo of the college can be displayed in the report.
- 5 The project report should be hard bound/ spiral bound / paper back.

6B15 MAT: PROJECT

A student of B.Sc. Mathematics should compulsorily do a project work on a topic of his/her choice and prepare a project dissertation for completing the B.Sc. Mathematics Pogramme. The project work should satisfy the following criteria.

- 1. The topic of study should not be a part of the existing syllabus. But it can be an extension of a topic of the syllabus.
- 2. After the completion of the study, the student shall submit a project dissertation to the university in typed form.
- 3. The dissertation should have at least 15 pages excluding the page of table of contents.
- 4. The dissertation can be prepared using any typesetting software like LaTeX, MS Word or Libre Office Writer.
- 5. The project work can be done individually if the student so wishes. It can be done as a group having maximum 3 students.
- 6. The dissertation should contain a Title Page, Certificate from the Project Guide/Supervisor countersigned by the Head of the Department, Table of Contents, Preface/Introduction and References.

2. Project Work and Viva Voce

a) Each student shall carry out a project work in one of the broad areas of theoretical/Organic/physical/environmental/inorganic chemistry for a period of minimum 12 weeks duration in the IVth semester under the supervision of a teacher of the department. A student may, in certain cases be permitted to do the project work in an industrial/research organization on the recommendation of the department coordinator. In such cases, one of the teachers from the department shall act as co-supervisor.

b) The candidate shall submit 2 copies of the dissertation based on the results of the project work at the end of the program.

c) Every student has to do the project work independently. No group projects are accepted. The project should be unique with respect to title, project content and project layout. No two project report of any students should be identical, in any case as this may lead to the cancellation of project report by the university.

d) The ESE of the project work shall be conducted by two external examiners. The evaluation of the project will be done at two stages.

i. Internal evaluation (supervising teacher/s will assess the project and award internal marks)

- ii. External evaluation (by external examiners appointed by the university)
- e) Pass conditions
 - i. The students shall declare to pass the project report course if she/he secures minimum of 40% marks (internal and external put together). In an instance of inability of obtaining a minimum of 40% marks, project work may be redone and the report may be resubmitted along with subsequent exams through parent department. There shall be no improvement chance for the marks obtained in the project report.
